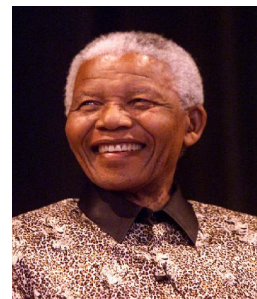

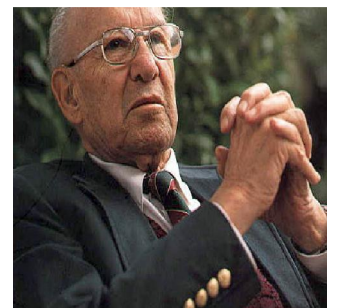

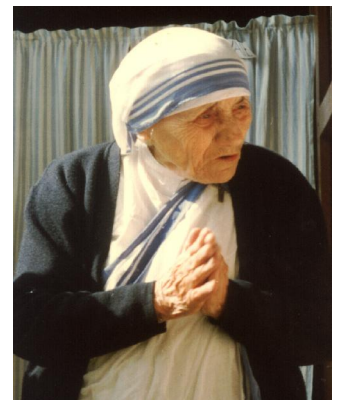

Papers should be no-longer than 35 pages (double spaced) including tables, graphs, references and endnotes. The formatting of the paper has to follow guidelines of the journal of business ethics.
